### Client app organization


Right now, the user interacts with Blockstack via two channels:

- 1. Blockstack browser (account management, app discovery platform, and auth/registration)
- 2. Blockstack.org marketing site

Since we're moving toward a full remote experience (no need to install a local blockstack), we can provide the full blockstack experience on blockstack.org.

The coolest part about this is that blockstack.org could be a Blockstack app!

### Blockstack.org




#### NOTES

People go to our blockstack.org website to learn more about us. It's an entry point to hubs like the Developer center, Resource Center, Blog, etc.

All of this is still accessible, but our users will likely be interacting with the app store the most, so this should be front and center.

- 1. The app store can itself be a Blockstack app (yay dogfooding!)
- 2. Clear separation of marketing pages and app store pages
- 3. App store should be a standalone module / React app we can plug in. This way, when we scale, the app store can be its own team working on its own repo.


# Blockstack.org (logged in)



### NOTES

Notice that once you login, you have a personalized app store experience. You could be presented with apps you've used and apps you watch. You can also navigate into the account management side of Blockstack from the upper right dropdown.



# blockstack.org/accounts




### NOTES

# blockstack.org/accounts (identities dropdown)




#### NOTES
